Hebrews 13:7 (AMP)

God will always give a vision or Word to a man or woman of God. When you support that Word, you will fulfill the call of God on your life. Sitting under a visionary is unlike anything else. They have seen the future that faith and belief will create. They will not be ok with you just sitting there. Your life will have to come up to what they've seen. **COULD THE REASON YOU'RE NOT THERE YET BE, BECUASE YOU'RE NOT A VISION SUPPORTER?** (If you don't give, don't show up, don't encourage, it's because you haven't bought into the vision.)

# 1 Corinthians 4:15 (NASB)

#### 15 For if you were to have countless tutors in Christ, yet you would not have many fathers, for in Christ Jesus I became your father through the gospel.

There is a reason your pastors teach you different than other people do. They have a different perspective. The way God honors you is by giving your pastors His perspective. He/she has the benefit of God's Word. **THE VOCABULARY OF THE KINGDOM IS DIFFERENT.** Let the weak say.... Let the poor say... In the gift God gave you is the ability to access His perspective through His gift.

## 1 Kings 19:19-21 (NASB)

19 So he departed from there and found Elisha the son of Shaphat, while he was plowing with twelve pairs of oxen before him, and he with the twelfth. And Elijah passed over to him and threw his mantle on him. 20 He left the oxen and ran after Elijah and said, "Please let me kiss my father and my mother, then I will follow you." And he said to him, "Go back again, for what have I done to you?"

21 So he returned from following him, and took the pair of oxen and sacrificed them and boiled their flesh with the implements of the oxen, and gave it to the people and they ate. Then he arose and followed Elijah and ministered to him.
